Dr. Horgan had been a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland since 1966. The Bronze Medal in Epidemiology was first awarded by RAMI's Section of Epidemiology and Public Health in 1983 to promote the recognition and dissemination of research in epidemiology. In 1998, the name of the medal was changed to the Jacqueline Horgan Bronze Medal in recognition of the late Dr Horgan's, work in the Department of Public Health Medicine and Epidemiology in UCD and her great contribution to epidemiology and public health in Ireland in her lifetime.
